REPORTING HATE INCIDENTS TO THE POLICE

- In an emergency, please dial 999 and ask to speak to the police
- In non-emergency you can contact the police on 101

PEOPLE WITH HEARING OR SPEECH IMPAIRMENT CAN CONTACT POLICE VIA

- If you've pre-registered with the <u>emergencySMS service</u>, use our **textphone service 18000** or text us on 999.
- Call <u>999 BSL</u> to use a British Sign Language interpreter.

Sussex Police will treat all hate incidents (Racist, Religiously motivated, Disability, Homophobic, Transphobic, and Biphobic) seriously and will respond effectively. If you need a **sign** or **language interpreter**, the police will be able to provide you with one.

TRUE-VISION ONLINE REPORTING TO THE LOCAL/SUSSEX POLICE:

You can report all hate incidents or crimes through the <u>True-Vision on-line facility</u> to the police. You can report all hate incidents or crimes that you may have been the victim of, witnessed, or are reporting on behalf of someone else.

REPORTING ONLINE TERRORIST / ILLEGAL MATERIAL

Counter Terrorism Internet Referral Unit (CTIRU): Report illegal terrorist information, pictures or videos you've found on the internet.

Some examples of illegal terrorist or extremist content include:

- Speeches or essays calling for racial or religious violence
- Videos of violence with messages of 'glorification' or praise for terrorists
- Postings inciting people to commit acts of terrorism or violent extremism
- Messages intended to stir up hatred against any religious or ethnic group

4. REPORTING ABUSIVE MATERIAL ON META / FACEBOOK:

Meta that owns Facebook, removes things that don't follow the <u>Meta Terms</u> (e.g.: coordinating harm including outing someone, promoting crime, nudity, bullying, graphic violence, spam). If you come across something on Meta that doesn't follow the Meta Terms, use the report link near the post or photo to submit a report.

As a policy, X do not mediate content or intervene in disputes between users. However, targeted abuse or harassment may constitute a violation of the X Rules and Terms of Service.
